New Business:

Open show report: None

April POR report: About \$30,000 was collected from the joint account. This number does not include the deductions for awards, judges and our part of the ring steward fees. There were more entries in some events including amateur, 14-17 and trail! (With 30 entries in sr. trail)

Brookside show report: **IF YOU NEED WORK HOURS THIS IS THE LAST SHOW TO WORK!!!** Judges so far are Carol Brock and Andrea Koehn. Youth and amateur

judges are Sally Jo Freund, Grant Gibbs, and Kim Gately. The dates are September 1-3, and the application is in to APHA. We need help for this show! Any volunteers would be helpful. We are still trying to decide whether or not there will be full jumping courses.

APHA workshop report-Libby: Some rule changes were discussed at the workshop including: 1 Horsemanship, showmanship, and equitation currently being a pointed class based on maneuvers rather than the rider's equitation while performing the maneuvers. They would like to make it a class placed based on the equitation of the rider.

2 splitting world show to amateur/ youth in the summer and open in the fall. 3 Name changes for amateur to Classic 19-44 and Masters 45 & over.

3 World show judge hiring procedures- Currently the APHA sends out evaluations to judges about other judges. They would like to make it more like NSBA where judges are recommended and then pulled from a hat.

4 Performance Halter- a halter class for horses pointed in performance classes (this one was tabled).

5 Trying to get more entry level entries at region shows, they are thinking of adding 5-10 APHA approved classes for paint exhibitors only, to earn regular paint points.

6 The new AJPCHA president is Sammie Jo Stone. Her new campaign is called "Be a lifesaver". She would like every club to have an American red cross drive, including a blood drive, clothing drive, or food drive.

7 APHA has received 5200 competed email surveys so far! 8 Slaughter houses are being banned and there is going to be an increase in unwanted horses. Please keep your eyes peeled for horses that look skinny or mistreated and report them.

8 Overall the APHA lost money last year.

9 Libby and Kevin Hardcastle are working on starting a new therapeutic riding program. They will bring horses to shows and contact the centers in the area of the show with challenged children to come out and participate with the horses at the show.

10 There is a new breed improvement committee who would like to present trophies instead of buckles at the world show next year. Buckles may also be purchased but will not be given out as prizes.

11 There was about \$6,000 collected from the silent auction May 31. Thanks to the club for their donations (7CPHC was the only club in CA to donate!!)

12 Two new committees were formed: Long range planning with Diane Paris, and Professional Horsemen's Association with Fred Tabor.

13 Discussion about having a walk/jog novice youth class added to shows so that new riders no matter the age (youth only) would be able to walk/ jog only and not have to compete with more seasoned riders. That would make youth classes as follows: w/j novice youth, novice youth (lope class), 5-9 w/j, and 13 & under.

14 There was also discussion about changing the ages for the 10 & under division.

A list of all discussions is available from Libby. There should also be minutes from the workshop available soon too. Thanks Libby.

CCC Report: Not available at this meeting, tabled until the next meeting where items can be voted on. The CCC meeting minutes will be available online also.

Zone show report: Utah still does not want to let it go!! Show is 2nd largest in the nation. Utah is saying that CA doesn't want it! 3 chairs from each state are on committee. There has to be a unanimous decision for choice of date and location.

Horse show committee is asking for anyone interested in helping with horse shows to give suggestions or become part of the committee! There are lots of jobs to do and anyone is welcome. The horse show committee does not have a set meeting schedule yet, but anyone can email suggestions or questions or ask at monthly meetings.

Nominations for Horseman of the year for the State of California need to be in by August. Nancy made a motion to nominate Bob and Katie Lentz. 2nd by Ed.
